There has been four TG1 meeting since formation of the Technical Group at the September 2000 TC39 meeting in Bristol, England.

5th November, 2000 in Mountain View, California, USA, hosted by Netscape. 5th December, 2000 in Cupertino, California, USA, hosted by Hewlett-Packard. 17th January, 2001 in Redmond, Washington, USA, hosted by Microsoft. 14th February, 2001 in Scottsdale, Arizona, USA, hosted by Intel.

The schedule has been:

Draft 4th Edition (perhaps a separate standard) Dec 2001 (target date only)

The Scope and Programme of Work for TG1 was accepted by the September 2000 TC39 meeting and December 2000 GA.

#### Scope

To standardise the syntax and semantics of a general purpose, cross platform, vendor-neutral dynamic scripting language.

#### Programme of Work

- 1. Develop dynamic scripting language standards.
- 2. Contribute ECMAScript standard to ISO/IEC JTC 1.
- 3. Upon completion of item 1, to investigate the future direction of ECMAScript standards, and to evaluate and consider proposals for complementary or additional technology.
- 4. To maintain liaison with appropriate other ECMA TCs and TGs.
