# 7.9.2 Presentation on the strategic direction for ECMAScript

**Mr. Schulze** gave a short presentation on how TC39-TG1 intends to arrive at a revamped edition of ECMA-262 "ECMAScript". This will be quite a challenging task.

TG1 has not yet decided on what might be done to support XML in CLI rather than in one language – ECMAScript – for which implementations exist running on CLI.
