The TCs were discussed in 4 groups. The minutes below follow the order of discussion:

1.5 TC39 - ECMAScript

Activity report: TC39/15/028.

Chairman: **Mr. John Neumann** (Microsoft, Yahoo, Mozilla, Google), Vice Chair: Vacant. **Mr. Sebestyen** gave a verbal activity report. Lot of activities, strong participation.



Work on the new Edition 6 of ECMAScript was completed and is being sent for June 2015 GA Approval. A new Edition of ECMA-402 is also in progress now with expected completion in June 2015. Both standards should be fast-tracked to ISO/IEC JTC 1 together with ECMA-404 2013 edition. "Opt-out" on all 3 standards have started and they will end before the June 2015 Ecma GA.

Further work on JSON is not concretely planned, but it is important that it does not diverge from the IETF JSON specification. Our liaison with IETF should assure that. We had a meeting with the responsible IETF Area Directors on that.

Work on ES7 is continuing. This is actually the current focus of the new technical contributions. To plan is to come out with yearly Editions of the ECMAScript standard, next 2016.
